

THE CHRONICLER'S MUSINGS

You know that May 12 is Mother's Day. But did you know...

In the U.S. Mothers' Day is a holiday celebrated on second Sunday in May. It is a day when children honor their mothers with cards, gifts, and flowers. First observance in Philadelphia, Pa. in 1907, it is based on suggestions by Julia Ward Howe in 1872 and Anna Jarvis in 1907.

Although it wasn't celebrated in the U.S. until 1907, there were days honoring mothers even in the days of ancient Greece. In those days, however, it was Rhea, the Mother of the gods that was given honor.

Later, in the 1600's, in England there was an annual observance called "Mothering Sunday." It was celebrated during Lent, on the fourth Sunday. On Mothering Sunday, the servants, who generally lived with their employers, were encouraged to return home and honor their mothers. It was traditional for them to bring a special cake along to celebrate the occasion.

In the U.S., in 1907 Ana Jarvis, from Philadelphia, began a campaign to establish a national Mother's Day. Jarvis persuaded her mother's church in Grafton, West Virginia to celebrate Mother's Day on the second anniversary of her mother's death, the 2nd Sunday of May. The next year Mother's Day was also celebrated in Philadelphia.

Jarvis and others began a letter-writing campaign to ministers, businessmen, and politicians in their quest to establish a national Mother's Day. They were successful. President Woodrow Wilson, in 1914, made the official announcement proclaiming Mother's Day a national observance that was to be held each year on the 2nd Sunday of May.

Many other countries of the world celebrate their own Mother's Day at different times throughout the year. Denmark, Finland, Italy, Turkey, Australia, and Belgium celebrate Mother's Day on the second Sunday in May, as in the U.S.

For those of you who asked for it, YOU got it, an explanation of the baronial awards:

The Order of the Sacred Stone was established in 1982 to recognize outstanding service and dedication to the Barony of the Sacred Stone over a long period of time and with the promise of continuing service in the future.

The Order of the Phœnix' Eye was established in 1982 to recognize outstanding Arts & Sciences achievements within the Barony of the Sacred Stone. This includes the teaching of that art in the Barony and its use on the Barony's behalf.

The Order of the Phænix' Claw was established in 1983 to recognize outstanding performance on the field of battle in heavy weapons within the Barony of the Sacred Stone. In 1991, Baron Bran Trefonnen opened this Order to rapier as well.

The Order of the Phœnix' Heart was established in 1988 to recognize courtesy and chivalry in the Barony of the Sacred Stone.

The Order of the Yeomen of the Sacred Stone was created in 1991 to recognize outstanding light weapons contributions on the field, specifically archers and scouts.

The Award of the Flame of the Phænix was first given in 1986 as special recognition for the contributions of newcomers to the Barony. It is now an award recognizing an outstanding feat of service in the Barony.

The Award of the Feather of the Phænix was first given in 1986 to recognize the special contributions made by the Barony's children.

The Baronial Award of Excellence was first given in 1991 and recognizes outstanding achievement in the arts & sciences by a specific work or project.

The Award of the Talon of the Phœnix was first given in 1992 and recognizes outstanding achievement on the field of battle during a specific event.

The Award of the Drakken Egg was first given in 1993 to recognize contributions made on the behalf of newcomers. It is now an award recognizing outstanding contributions made by newcomers.

The Award of the Spirit of the Phænix was first given in 2001 and recognizes contributions made on behalf of the Barony from people who live outside its geographical boundaries.

And now the Kingdom level awards:

In Atlantia, royal peerages are accompanied by Patents of Arms if the person does not already have one. Those who have reigned as gueen are inducted into the Order of the Rose upon completion of their reign.

Territorial Barons and Baronesses receive Grants of Arms at their investiture. The Crown may also award Grants of Arms at their discretion, showing a higher degree of favor and recognition than an Award of Arms.

The positions of Court Baron and Baroness, given at the discretion of the Crown, convey an Award of Arms.



There are four Kingdom Orders of Merit, which rank equally in precedence. Awards of Arms accompany the Dolphin, Pearl and Sea Stag (if the recipient is not already armigerous); Grants of Arms accompany the Academie d'Espee. The Crown consults with the members of an Order of Merit before admitting a candidate.

Order of the Golden Dolphin (CGD): given to those subjects of the kingdom who have distinguished themselves by their service to Atlantia. The order's badge is: Per chevron enhanced engrailed argent and azure, in base a dolphin naiant to sinister Or.

Order of the Pearl (CP): given to those subjects of the kingdom who have distinguished themselves by their efforts and willingness to teach others the arts and sciences of the period, and/or those who have achieved excellence in the arts and sciences of the period. The order's badge is: [Fieldless] On an escallop inverted azure a plate.

Order of the Sea Stag (CSS): given to those subjects who have distinguished themselves by their teaching of the fighting arts of the period, The order's badge is: Azure, a stag's head cabossed and in base two tridents in saltire argent.

Academie d'Espee (the Order of the White Scarf of Atlantia): given to those subjects who have excelled in the exercise and advance of the noble art of fence, and have distinguished themselves as examples of the precepts to which it is devoted. The order's badge (subject to registration) is: Argent, a pale couped between two unicornate seahorses azure.

There are also kingdom orders, which do not convey an Award of Arms. As with the above Orders of Merit, an individual may only be admitted to an order once:

Queen's Order of Courtesy (QOC): given by the Queen to those subjects she deems worthy by reason of their consistently exemplary courtesy to subjects of all ranks in the Realm and in the Society at large. The Queen may call upon the members to assist her with their aid or advice in encouraging courteous behavior, whenever she may deem this necessary, and the members are bound to assist the Queen to the best of their abilities. The token given is usually a medallion bearing an escallop.

Order of St. Aiden: given to unbelted fighters for their exemplary demonstration of martial skills upon the field of battle, for their leadership abilities, and for their service to the kingdom. Membership in the order is only upon recommendation from the order to the King of Atlantia, and upon their induction, members receive an Augmentation of Arms. This order provides an elite fighting force to aid in the training of the Atlantian Army. The Atlantian warlord may call upon the order once per war to perform any mission he deems necessary upon the field of battle. Members who become Peers of the realm are made Companions Emeritus; while no longer vested members, they may be called on to aid, advise, and serve their brothers in peace and war.

There are a number of Kingdom Awards; an individual can receive any of these more than once:

Order of the Yew Bow: given to those subjects who have distinguished themselves by their skill with bow and arrow, either target or combat. It recognizes also their leadership in furthering combat or target archery education and techniques, and their honorable deportment on and off the field. The order's badge is: [Fieldless] A unicornate natural seahorse's head erased, maintaining in its mouth an arrow inverted bendwise. All past members of the Order of the King's Missiliers and the Order of the Nimrod (which are now closed) will be considered to be members of this order.



Order of the Sea Urchin: given to children sixteen years of age and under who have distinguished themselves by their contributions to the kingdom. Recipients may wear a badge: [Fieldless] A Sea Urchin argent.

Order of the Non Pareil: given to those who have shown excellence, honor, courtesy, and chivalry above and beyond any duty. The members of this Order exemplify what it means to be an Atlantian. The award may be given only once per reign.

King's Award of Excellence (KAE): given to those the king deems deserving, who have distinguished themselves by their excellent contributions to the kingdom. The token is a gold pendant, upon which is inscribed the king's initial, in blue.

Undine: given to those subjects the queen deems deserving, who have distinguished themselves with exceptional service to her. The token is a blue pendant, upon which is inscribed the queen's initial, in gold.

Shark's Tooth: given to those who have performed acts of valor for the kingdom. It may be awarded by the King and Queen jointly or individually. The token is a shark's tooth.

Herring: given to those who have distinguished themselves by extraordinary achievement as autocrats.

Silver Nautilus: given to those who have distinguished themselves by an extraordinary achievement in the Arts and Sciences. The badge of the order is: [Fieldless] A nautilus shell argent.

Kraken: given to those non-belted fighters who have distinguished themselves by an extraordinary achievement on the field. The badge of the order is: [Fieldless] A kraken Or.

Hippocampus: honors and recognizes those young people (from 10 to 17), whose service and contributions to the kingdom have distinguished them in the eyes of the Crown and kingdom.

Directions

From I-40 East or West: Take NC Hwy. 18 towards Shelby. Turn Right on NC Hwy. 10 towards Casar, go about 8 miles, turn Left onto St. Paul's Church Rd., go 2 miles, turn Right on Hull Rd., go $\frac{1}{2}$ mile, Camp Loy White is on the Left.

From I-85 North or South: Take US Hwy. 74 to Shelby, follow Business 74 to the right, after 1.5 miles go north (Right) on NC Hwy. 180. After 5.1 miles turn right on NC Hwy. 18. Go approx. 9 miles & turn Left on Carpenter's Grove Road (there is a sign for Camp Loy White and also one for Belwood Community Center at this intersection). Go 2.5 miles. Turn Left on St. Paul's Church Rd., go 2 miles and turn Left on Hull Rd. Go $\frac{1}{2}$ mile, then Left into Camp Loy White.
